#### WHOWEARE

We are a private, non-profit organization dedicated to the restoration, capital support, management and operation of historic Thalian Hall. A volunteer Board of Trustees is responsible for development of policy and acquisition of sufficient financial resources for the theatre's operations. Under the Trustees' direction, the Executive Director supervises the staff and daily operations of the complex. Thalian Hall Center for the Performing Arts, Inc. belongs to the League of Historic American Theatres and the North Carolina Presenters Consortium.

#### WHAT WE DO

We bring professional artists to Wilmington. Ramsey Lewis, the Dixie Chicks, the Moscow Grigorovich Ballet and Barbara Cook are only a few of the world-class performers who have appeared on stage at Thalian Hall through our Main Attractions series. We also present works for the Adventures in Art family series and critically acclaimed films through our Cinematique program.

THCPA works to support the growth and development of performing arts in New Hanover County. The facility is the regular performance space of a wide range of community arts organizations. Productions include those of our primary rental clients, Opera House Theatre Company and the venerable Thalian Association Community Theatre. We also provide marketing and audience development services, and centralized box office services for over 30 non-profit arts groups.



Support for the theatre is maintained through our "Friends of Thalian Hall" membership program, the City of Wilmington, state and regional grants and the generosity of our Producers' circle sponsors. By supporting THCPA. these individuals and institutions underwrite the cost of operations of the facilities, making rental very affordable for a variety of arts and community groups including the Thalian Association, Opera House Theatre Company, Theatre Exchange Society, The Willis Richardson Players and many other organizations that rent the facility. 

### **THALIAN** HALL THROUGH THE YEARS



#### 1803-1855

Trustees of the Innes Academy purchase 3 lots where Thalian Hall currently stands and advertise for the construction of

a "house suitable for an Academy and Theatre." Once completed, it hosts performances by early Thalian Associations and many touring theatre companies, including those of Joseph Jefferson and Iunius Brutus Booth.

#### 1853-1856

City of Wilmington determines to build City Hall and theatre on Academy site. The 4th Thalian Association agrees to complete the interior of the theatre and pay an annual rent. The Academy is demolished and construction begins under the direction of James F. Post.

#### 1858

Thalian Hall opens with a performance by G. F. Marchants stock company of the popular romantic comedy The Honey Moon, followed by the farce The Loan of A Lover. Over 85 nights of entertainment are presented in the first season, including three productions by the Thalian Association.

#### 1860-1936

After two years, the Thalian Association, faced with insurmountable debt, surrenders the theatre to the City and for the next 75 years, Thalian Hall is leased



to private entrepreneurs who operate the theatre, book performances and rent the theatre to touring companies and locals.

#### 1861-1865

The Civil War creates economic boom for Wilmington and Thalian Hall, under the name of "The Wilmington Theatre" hosts over 250 performances for the 1863-1864 season and 285 performances the following season.

#### 1869

John T. Ford (right), of Ford's Theatre in Washington, leases Thalian Hall after the assassination of Lincoln. Under Ford's tenure,



repairs are made to theatre and its name is changed to the "Opera House."

#### 1870-1920

The heyday of touring theatre occurs



during these years with over 100 touring events annually. Great stars include Buffalo Bill Cody, John Phillip Sousa, Edwin Forrest, James O'Neill, Maurice Barrymore, and Lillian Russell (left).

#### 1882

Playwright Oscar Wilde (*left*) entertains Wilmington audiences with his lecture on aesthetics.

#### 1884

Joseph Jefferson, world famous actor known for his role of Rip Van Winkle, appears in all-star production of The

Rivals with Mrs. John Drew, grandmother of John, Lionel, and Ethel Barrymore.

#### 1890-1900

During this decade many amateur theatre productions are presented by local groups such as the Colonial Dames, the Ministering Circle, and the Westminster League. There are also performances by amateur theatre societies including the Paint and Powder Club and The Wilmington Dramatic Club.



#### 1906-1956

Wilmington's Public Library is established on the 2nd floor of City Hall and remains in that location for 50 years.

#### 1902

Under lessee Simeon A. Schloss of Wilmington, the name is changed to "The Academy of Music." (right) In 1909, the interior is renovated with electric lights, an ornate proscenium arch and decorative painting. The side balconies are removed and the windows closed.



#### 1923-1928

Community interest in the arts develops in this period with the formation of the Wilmington Concert Association. the Thursday Morning Music Club. the Wilmington Art League and the Little



Theatre Guild of Wilmington. By the end of the decade, touring theatre declines. In 1928, the Ziegfeld Follies is one of the last road shows to play the Hall.


#### 1929-1932

Little Theatre Guild changes its name to Thalian Association and presents an evening of one-acts. The name of the theatre is changed from "The Academy of Music" to "Thalian Hall" in 1932.

#### 1938-1941

Henry MacMillan leads the Thalian Association efforts to restore Thalian Hall. The City of Wilmington and WPA begin renovation, and in 1939, the north wall of City Hall collapses. Concern over structural integrity threatens the future of the building. After much study and discus-

sion the City proceeds with the renovation with additional funds from WPA. Thalian Association repaints the interior of the theatre.



### THALIAN HALL THROUGH THE YEARS (CONT.)

#### 1941-1947

Thalian Association operates theatre until structural issues force its closure.

#### 1947-1951

Theatre remains closed until 1951, when City of Wilmington undertakes repairs on balconies and theatre structure and the theatre reopens under management of the Thalian Association in 1952.

#### 1963-1967

Wilmington College and Thalian Association join forces to co-produce theatre in Thalian Hall.

#### 1963

Through the efforts of the **Junior League** and the City of Wilmington, the Thalian Hall

Commission, Inc. is formed to preserve and restore Thalian Hall as a regional center for the performing arts.

#### 1973-1974

Fire occurs in the theatre and Thalian Hall closes. An agreement is created between the City and the Thalian Hall Commission, Inc. for the restoration of the theatre. A fundraising campaign under the leadership of Thomas H. Wright, Jr. raises approximately \$300,000 for the restoration of the theatre to its turn-of-the-century appearance.



Thalian Hall reopens under the management of Thalian Hall Commission. Inc, which subleases theatre to many arts groups including the Thalian Association.


#### 1983

A 2.4 million dollar Master Renovation and Expansion Plan is developed by the Thalian Hall Commission, Inc. using Theatre Projects of London and Boney Architects of Wilmington.

#### 1983

The 125th anniversary of the opening of the theatre is celebrated with an original musical produced by Thalian Hall Commission Inc. the Arts Council, the Thalian Association, and Mr. & Mrs. Walter Pancoe. The City of Wilmington approves the Master Renovation Plan and includes Thalian Hall in a bond issue.

## The Wilmington Cheesesteak Story

The Philadelphia Cheesesteak was brought to Wilmington thirty years ago by business partners J. Michael Hutson and Lou Nieper. Their first store was opened at Hanover Center on August 17, 1979. Since then, two more stores have been added at Porters Neck and Monkey Junction.

The workforce has also expanded from 12 employees to 125. A significant number of these people have made careers here. Twenty staff members have ten-plus years of service, and three have twenty-plus years. The Philly Deli began by offering flexible schedules. This has always been a significant benefit to mothers, students, and other part-timers. Later, health and den-

tal benefits, and vacation pay were added for full-time workers.

One thing hasn't changed: the quality. The Philly Deli started out by importing all of their steak meat and hoagie rolls straight from Philadelphia. It is a practice they still maintain to this day.

The Philly Deli has seen Wilmington go through a number of growth periods, slower periods, good times, and tough times. However, by operating a good workplace, keeping a solid and experienced management staff, and consistently offering quality food at reasonable prices, they have managed to maintain the staying power that has kept them in business for almost thirty years.

#### 1984-1985

A citywide bond issue passes and \$1.7 million becomes available

for the renovation project. After directing a production of **Man of La Mancha** for the Thalian Hall Commission and the Thalian Association, New York actor Lou Criscuolo moves to Wilmington and begins producing under the name of Opera House Theatre Company.

#### 1986

"Thalian Hall Commission, Inc." changes its name to the "Thalian Hall Center for the Performing Arts, Inc." (THCPA) and begins a capital campaign under the chairmanship of Mrs. William H. Sutton and Mrs. Franklin Block.

#### 1988

The renovation and expansion project



#### 1990

Project completed; grand reopening occurs on

March 2 with Peter

Nero and NC Symphony, followed by 2 weeks of performances by many Wilmington arts organizations. Thalian Hall Center for the Performing Arts, Inc. establishes an annual membership (Friends of Thalian Hall) and the Main Attractions Series.

#### 1995-1998

THPCA, Inc. begins a series of improvements including the installation of film projectors, establishing the Cinematique series. A new Steinway concert piano is given to the Hall by the Weyerhaeuser Family and the Kenan Foundation.

#### 2002-2003

Architects Hanbury & Evans and Theatre Consultant Robert Long are chosen by the THCPA, Inc. to develop a master plan for the renovation of Thalian Hall and the addition of a new 250-seat playhouse.

#### 2004-2008

THCPA, Inc. begins work on the development of a capital campaign and the City of Wilmington commits \$3 million for the project. The design for the new playhouse is approved by the Historic Preservation Commission.





comedy, directs this holiday tour from historic Springer Opera House, the official State Theatre of Georgia.





### HIROMI

Jazz piano phenom Hiromi took her first piano lessons at age six in Japan. The next year, she was enrolled in the Yamaha School of Music. At age 12, she performed with the Czech Philharmonic. At 17, a chance meeting with Chick Corea led to a performance with the well-known pianist the very next day in Tokyo.

Hiromi came to the U.S. in 1999 to study at Berklee College of Music in Boston. Among her mentors at Berklee was veteran jazz bassist Richard Evans, who teaches arranging and orchestration. In 2003, Evans co-produced Another Mind, her Telarc debut recording, with longtime friend and collaborator Ahmad Jamal, who calls Hiromi "nothing short of amazing. Her music causes her to soar to unimaginable musical heights."

Her first album went gold and received Japan's Jazz Album of the Year Award. Her second release, Brain, won the Horizon Award, Swing Journal's New Star Award, Jazz Life's Gold Album, HMV Japan's Best Japanese Jazz Album, and was named Album of the Year in Swing Journal's 2005 Readers Poll. In 2006, Hiromi won Best Jazz Act at the Boston Music Awards and the Guinness Jazz Festival's Rising Star Award. She also claimed Jazzman



of the Year, Pianist of the Year and Album of the Year in **Swing Journal Japan's** Readers Poll for her 2006 release **Spiral**. Hiromi continued her winning streak with the releases of **Time Control** (2007) and **Beyond Standard** (2008), both releases including Hiromi's super group, Sonic Bloom.

At 26, Hiromi stands at the threshold of limitless possibility. Her list of influences, like her music itself, is boundless. "I love Bach, I love Oscar Peterson, I love Franz Liszt, I love Ahmad Jamal," she says. "I also love people like Sly and the Family Stone, Dream Theatre and King Crimson. I'm so inspired by sports players like Carl Lewis and Michael Jordan. I'm inspired by anyone who has big, big energy. They really come straight to my heart."

Hiromi won't, as a matter of principle, put labels on her music. "It has some elements of classical music, rock, jazz – but I don't want to give it a name. It's just the union of what I've been listening to and what I've been learning." She'll leave all the tags to those who feel required to have them.



### JESSE COOK

### A CO-PRESENTATION WITH UNC-W

### SAT, MAR 28 · 8 PM

You are about to journey to a new universe. You'll be returned safely once the final encore has ended – if you want. But be warned that Jesse Cook's music is a thunderous power surge from the gods, and it transports you to new realms.

It's entirely possible we have people hiding under the seats who've refused to leave the building since Jesse Cook was last here two years ago. He seems to have that effect wherever he goes. The virtuoso guitarist's expressive rumba flamenco arrangements fuse age-old musical rhythms with a host of world influences. He is a musical nomad, a cultural sponge who has spent a lifetime absorbing sounds from Spain, Africa, Cuba, Egypt, France and Brazil.

While musicians often speak of major professional influences, for Jesse Cook it is not so much an individual, but a region in southern France known as the Camargue. It was here in Arles where the young Cook spent many summers with his father, a retired film director. Jesse wandered the streets among the Gypsies who inhabit the area, soaking up the atmosphere and listening to the likes of Nicolas Reyes,



lead singer of the flamenco group "Gipsy Kings" who lived next door, and whom Cook still credits with his own percussive approach to the guitar.

Born in Paris, Jesse first picked up a toy guitar at age three. He moved to Canada as a young child, and listened intently to his mother's flamenco records. Following subsequent studies at York University and Berklee College of Music. he released his first recording in 1995. Record sales now exceed millions worldwide, and his 2007 release Frontiers still rides high on charts from North America to Europe to Dubai. Frontiers was named World Music Album of the Year at the 2008 Juno awards, and One Night at the Metropolis, which captures a spectacular concert during the 2006 Montreal Jazz Festival, received Music DVD of the Year.

Cook and his remarkable band leave audiences gasping, not only in awe at the virtuosity, indescribable talent and delivery – but from the explosive catharsis the man's music seems to invite. It's one of those moments of live performance that creates scars – for the better – for all time.

### SUSAN WERNER

When Susan Werner's on stage, whether at the piano or her guitar, there's a scale of personality, presence and brilliance that seems somehow delivered through an invisible, gigantic zoom lens. The magnification works from both ends, from stage to audience and back the other way. If you listen, you quickly realize how each moment is simply so very big, open – and filled with truth.

She is a singer-songwriter who crosses genres and styles with astonishing depth and freshness. Considered among the industry's most promising popular lyricist/composers, Werner reaps glowing press from some of the nation's most respected critics. When **The New Yorker** says you're a performer "who brings literacy and wit back to popular song" and the **Chicago Tribune** writes that you exhibit "genuine distinction, high craft," it's substantial affirmation that brings notice.

Raised on a farm in rural Iowa, Susan Werner began her professional music career in Philadelphia, after studying classical voice at Temple University. Inspired by a Nanci Griffith concert, Werner left behind her opera training and began performing as a singer-songwriter at coffeehouses



throughout the northeast. She self-released her first album in 1992.

In 2004, she recorded her album of instant Cole Porter-like classics, **I Can't Be New**. Fans and critics alike sang her praises: the **All Music Guide** calling it "a brilliantly constructed, soulful, and cleverly tender effort by a songwriter and musician who is in such complete command of her gifts that it's almost scary."

2007 brought the release of Werner's The Gospel Truth, a collection of originals she describes as "hymns for the spiritually ambivalent." This project surveys the wide variety of attitudes toward the Church in America and incorporates styles ranging from traditional bluegrass gospel, in songs such as "My Lord Will Trouble Me," to a hand-clapping rouser for agnostics entitled "Probably Not."

Howard Reich, chief critic of the **Chicago Tribune**, wrote in 2006: "Werner is one of the most innovative songwriters working today." There are no easy ways to adequately describe this artist's gifts. If you're a person who searches for true wit, honesty of message and singular talent, you deserve Susan Werner.




